

### Questions for completion by the doctor

1. You wrote a note February 2, 2017 saying: **“I am the primary care physician of Charlie Eikland Jr. Due to medical reasons he is unable to respond and defend any current human rights complaints to the human rights board of adjudicators for at least 3 months.”** What were the specific limitations or restrictions he faced at that time with respect to dealing with his human rights complaint?
2. Did you reassess him after 3 months?
3. Is Mr. Eikland’s medical condition referenced in your note dated February 2, 2017 the same or related to the condition referenced in your October 13, 2017 note?
4. When was the last time you met with Mr. Eikland regarding his condition?
5. Has Mr. Eikland been following a treatment plan over the course of the past 10 months?
6. Has Mr. Eikland’s condition shown any improvement in a way that would allow for a plan to proceed to a scheduled hearing date?
7. What limitations or restrictions result from Mr. Eikland’s condition?
8. What limitations or restrictions result from Mr. Eikland’s prescribed course of treatment?
9. Is the nature of Mr. Eikland’s condition transient or constant/sustained?
10. Are there any factors that bring on or worsen the occurrence of the condition that might be avoided or decreased?
11. A hearing before the Yukon Human Rights Board of Adjudication will require Mr. Eikland to listen to the case being put against him by both the Commission and the Complainant, cross-examine the witnesses put forward by the opposing parties if he so chooses, present his defense, and call his own witnesses if he so chooses. The hearing is an adversarial process, and takes place in a public setting over the course of the scheduled dates with breaks provided.

- a. In what ways do the limitations resulting from Mr. Eikland's medical condition and treatment prevent him from participating in these proceedings?
- b. Are there ways in which the proceedings may be altered in order to accommodate Mr. Eikland's limitations?
